

Greetings Nobles and Ladies,

I hope everyone is having a safe and productive harvest. The following is a continuation of my notes from the strategic planning meeting that was in September at Woodbury.

Audrey Haugen gave an update on Child Life. The goal of Child Life is to reduce the level of stress and to create a better experience for the kids. Audrey helps kids understand what is going on while helping them express the feelings they are having during these difficult times.

Often these appointments can be intense, so I strongly believe it is critical to have Child Life involved. She often is in the room to help with distractions during tests or exams. Tools she uses are robots, toys, or a simple conversation. She also observes kids to see if they need a break during the appointments to allow them to process what is going on. Audrey also tries to incorporate families into the process. Another important part of Child Life are camps. I am always amazed by the excitement and normalcy these camps can provide. During Imperial Session at Minneapolis, Child Life did a couple of skits at the marketplace. This gave us a firsthand view of the importance of camps. Camps allow kids to interact with other kids that have similar challenges and give them confidence to do these activities at home. This was a great reminder during Imperial of why we are here. I am proud that Shriners Children Twin Cities put on this event and hopefully this will continue at future Imperials.

Jeff Bruce reviewed the POPS (Pediatric Orthotic and Prosthetic Services) department. Right now, the central fabrications departments are located in Tampa and Portland. The Twin Cities location receives these items from Tampa. The department had 1,639 visits in 2020, 1,910 visits in 2021, and 1,053 visits through July in 2022. They also delivered 991 units in 2020, 1,231 units in 2021, and 1,053 units through July in 2022. Supply shortages has added time to the process, especially if a piece breaks. Thankfully the staff is trained to get creative, placing a temporary fix until the piece is delivered. Discussion has been occurring on ordering an industrial (not regular) 3D printer. Unfortunately, very few pieces can be made via a 3D printer. According to Jeff, the software is created to make pieces and the 3D printers can produce the pieces but the material isn't strong enough YET to make pieces sturdy enough to hold long term. Currently the pieces we do receive are outsourced. The Twin Cities board passed a resolution encouraging the purchase of a 3D printer as more and more pieces have the ability to be made this way. An interesting fact that Jeff was reviewing is the insurance reimbursement rate in the POPS department. Currently 87% of the POPs department expenses are covered by insurance, meaning the other 13% comes from the endowment. Roughly seven years ago, before we started submitting claims to insurance, 100% of the expenses were funded by the endowment. As of July 2022, the department spent \$587,979 and received \$511,186 from insurance companies. Currently two locations in Spokane & Portland actually bring in more

money from insurance than expenses in the POPS department. Jeff stated the decision to change the prosthetics or orthotic is based on when the child needs the upgrade versus if the insurance or family can pay for it. That is one of Jeff's favorite parts working for Shriners Children's, is being able to assist the kids regardless of the family's ability to pay. The cranial helmet is a new program offered at Shriners Children's Twin Cities. It is always exciting to see new programs being rolled out at the facility. I recently got the privilege of meeting the parents and child who is currently utilizing the services of the POPS department of Shriners Children's Twin Cities at a Britton Shrine Club fundraiser. The prosthetic was working well and the camp she attended got rave reviews from her. It was reassuring hearing the good work being done at the facility.
